# 'TOWARDS A JOYFUL FUTURE'

LEARNING FROM MURMURATIONS

Dear brothers and sisters,

Everywhere we look it is clear we live in strange and unsettling times. By faith we know that God is working out his purposes. We see encouraging signs of this here in Wigan, such as growing unity among the churches and young enquirers turning up to explore faith. In all our parishes there has been beautiful creativity in mission resulting in growth over the last two years that has bucked national trends.

At the same time, things aren't like they used to be. Thanks to our wonderful volunteers, lay leaders and clergy we still do great things. But we have less people and money now, and many are tired. The feeling is, we're spinning too many plates. It's also apparent that we can't force our way back into flourishing by simply working harder or relying on the tried and tested methods of the past. We've all been asking, what can we do?

And then, this summer, God spoke to us.
The word was 'murmuration'.

A murmuration is the jaw-dropping spectacle performed by starlings. As dusk approaches, thousands of birds move together in swirling, shifting patterns. It's mysterious, mesmerising and beautiful. Watching a video of a murmuration, one of our clergy exclaimed, 'This is worship!'

And God appeared to say to us, 'I have a plan for you, one to prosper you and give you hope and a future. But it is my plan, not yours. Like starlings taking to the wing to join others and become the murmuration, your role is to join in with the things I reveal to you.'

We realised that our future sustainability will not be secured by our brilliant strategies and working ever harder, but by discerning God's priorities for us, season by season, and embodying these in wise planning. We call this joyful obedience, an attitude to ministry that doesn't try to keep everything going at all costs but does the thing God highlights using the resources freely available to us. It's about spinning less plates and moving toward a future which is less anxious and more joyful.

This long journey towards a joyful future has started with listening: to God and each other. After much listening, this autumn our PCCs will agree on the priorities that, in faith, they believe the Spirit is showing them. Then, over the following months, clear plans will be formulated to embody these priorities, using the resources God has already given to us. We will do what we can, not what we can't, trusting God to provide.

Your PCC will keep you informed of what's happening. In the meantime, keep praying for a joyful future where God's will is done 'in Wigan as in heaven.'


# The Well - Dates & Speakers
