WASHING THE FEET OF WIGAN

THE IMPORTANCE OF SERVING OTHERS AS WE FOLLOW THE EXAMPLE OF JESUS

Anyone who has ever explored a calling to Christian ministry and leadership will have been challenged early on with Jesus' words found in Mark 10.44-45. 'For the Son of Man [that is, Jesus himself] did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

He was confronting the self-serving attitudes of his disciples, to help them understand that a willingness to serve, rather than achieving status or position or success, is how God judges greatness. Christ came to serve; therefore, the chief call of those who follow him is also to serve. That's why service is a key 'beat' in our rhythm of discipleship.

I remember a group of Chinese Christians recounting the story of a young mother who had become a follower of Jesus in the days of great persecution in that country. She heard the Holy Spirit prompt her to share the good news of Christ in front of the police station. She thought at first it was a demon trying to get her into trouble, but after repeatedly hearing the voice she was convinced it was God. So she obeyed.

Within minutes she was arrested and later sentenced to spend several years in a women's prison. Her young son was removed by the Party and raised to hate her. She seemed to lose everything. Yet 800 women at the jail found faith in Christ through her. The service was costly, but the eternal reward priceless.

That is a dramatic example, yet serving comes in many guises. Scripture tells us that there is no hierarchy of service; to faithfully scrub the toilets at church is as

honourable - perhaps more honourable - as being Archbishop of Canterbury. And of course, service is not limited to what we do in church. We can easily forget that vital Christian witness and service is done in the workplace, in the family, in other spaces where the light of the gospel is needed.

I feel privileged to be part of a church here in Wigan which has committed itself so wholeheartedly to serving people of all ages and means in our local communities. We offer hundreds of organised activities that 'wash the feet' of Wigan (mostly, but not exclusively, in a metaphorical sense) and thousands of everyday small acts of service done by our members in the course of their daily lives.

But we can't be complacent. We can still be subject to our fallen human nature which tempts us to put our own selfish desires at the heart of everything. It's not that being a Christian forces us to ignore our own real needs but that, as we follow the Servant King's example, we find a deeper joy as we serve others and find our own needs wonderfully met on the way. 'For we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him and have been called according to his purpose' (Romans 8.28).

Thank you for your service in Christ's name. To encourage you in this, why don't you come to The Well on Sunday 6th September to meet our wonderful new Bishop of Warrington as he speaks about the vital counterpart of service: the Christian discipline of rest. You can find the details inside. May the Lord sustain you in service and grant you refreshing rest.

A Farewell Note from Revd. Sam Nicholson

After 30 years of ministry, 18 of which have been spent serving in Wigan, Revd. Canon Sam Nicholson moved on from her role in Church Wigan at the end of August to become a hospital chaplain at the Royal Albert Edward Infirmary. Sam will be very much missed. We are very thankful for her care, ministry, wisdom and friendship. Sam has written a note below to reflect on her time in ministry and say a very fond farewell.

On 3 September 2008, I was licensed as Vicar of St Catharines, Scholes, and Christ Church, Ince. It was my first experience of leading more than one church, and their first experience of sharing one. It wasn't always easy, but one of my greatest joys was watching two communities gradually come together, get to know one another and enjoy each other's company. In time, that team of two became part of a central hub, joining St Andrew's, St Anne's and St Mary's. I have particularly happy memories of our hub parish weekend away and seeing the churches working and growing together.

In 2018, I moved to work alongside Rev Will Gibbons in the Town Centre hub - St George's, St Michael's, All Saints and St Mark's - with a particular focus on chaplaincy in the town. That opened up many new experiences and relationships. Then came my cancer diagnosis and Covid, bringing changes I certainly hadn't expected. I remain deeply grateful for the care, kindness and prayers I received during my illness.

Change came again when Will and I helped out in the North West parish, giving me the opportunity to meet and get to know even more people across Wigan. As an extrovert, I have always loved that - well, most of the time! Then Town Centre joined with Central, bringing me back into contact with people I had known before. Looking back, there has been a lot of change, and not all of it has been easy, but throughout it all I have valued the importance of working together. One of the things I have appreciated most about Church Wigan is the willingness of people to come together, share the load and support one another. Of course, like many of us, I wish there were more clergy and more leaders, but I am thankful for the many people who have given their time, gifts and friendship along the way. Now I am off to something new, beginning part-time hospital chaplaincy. I am excited about what lies ahead, but I leave with a very full heart and a deep sense of gratitude for the people and communities I have been privileged to share this journey with.

One final thought, although there has been much change, it is also true " Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" Hebrews 13.8

CELEBRATING 160 YEARS

OF ST JAMES WITH ST THOMAS' CHURCH, POOLSTOCK

This year, St James with St Thomas Church in Poolstock celebrates 160 years of worship, faith and service to the local community.

The roots of St James' reach back to September 1863, when its foundation stone was laid to create a place of worship for Poolstock's growing population. Three years later, on 15 September 1866, the church was consecrated. At the time, Poolstock was a thriving industrial community, with coal mining, mills and industry shaping the lives of local families.

Funded by Nathaniel Eckersley, a local colliery proprietor and Wigan MP, the church was established to serve the working people of the area. Eckersley was a strong supporter of education and opportunities for ordinary working people, values reflected in the church's purpose as a place to worship, learn, meet and belong. In 1970, St Thomas' Church closed and the two congregations united, forming the church we know today.

Over sixteen decades, people have passed through its doors for worship, baptisms, weddings, funerals, celebrations, moments of prayer and so much more. Through times of change and challenge, the church has remained a constant presence, sharing in the lives of local families.

Today, as part of Church Wigan's West Hub, worship, prayer, friendship and community remain at the church's heart. Through its cafe, food pantry, activities, services, groups and support for local people, it continues to be a pillar of faith in the community.

After 160 years, St James with St Thomas continues to worship, serve and welcome — keeping faith at the heart of Poolstock.

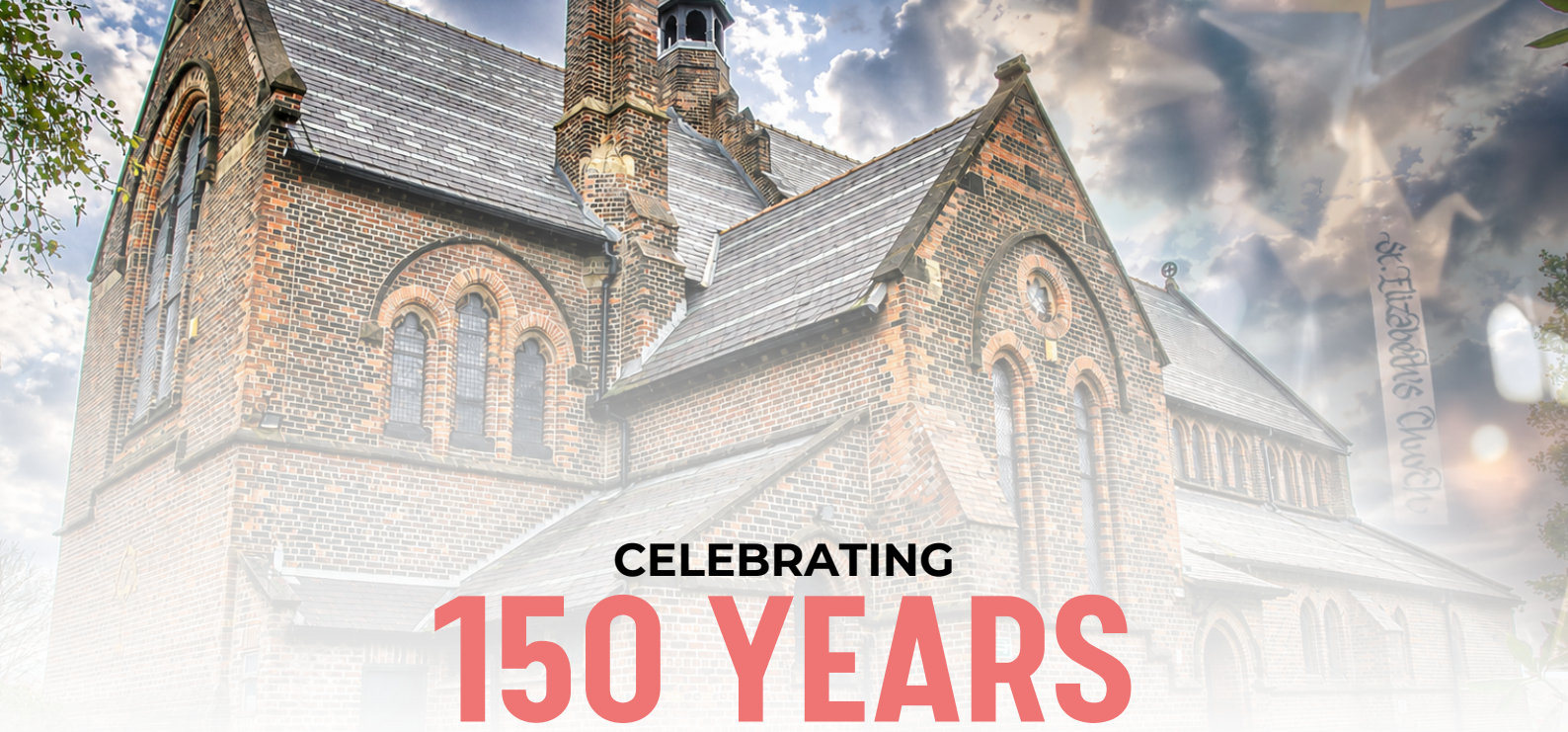

CELEBRATING 150 YEARS

OF ST ELIZABETH'S OF HUNGARY, ASPULL

St Elizabeth's Church, Aspull, has begun a very special anniversary year, marking 150 years since the laying of its foundation stone by Roger Leigh in August 1876.

The milestone was recently celebrated with a special Murmuration cake and fizz event, bringing the church community together to launch a year celebrating 150 years of faith, worship and community in Aspull.

St Elizabeth's was built when Aspull was growing rapidly. St David's, Haigh, had served the area since 1832, but by the time St Elizabeth's was consecrated in 1882, the population had quadrupled and a larger church was needed. Roger Leigh and the Earl of Crawford helped fund the £6,500 building project.

Over the past 150 years, St Elizabeth's has witnessed huge changes in Aspull. Its bricks could tell countless tales — of two World Wars, the sacrifices of local people, and the vibrant coal mining and steel industries that once shaped the community. Through all these changes, St Elizabeth's has stood strong at the heart of Aspull.

For 150 years, it has been a place of faith, prayer and fellowship, witnessing baptisms, weddings, confirmations, celebrations and countless important moments in people's lives. Through generations, it has offered a place to worship, find comfort and celebrate together.

We thank God for this special place and this wonderful church family. A special tribute must also go to the incredible volunteers and clergy whose time, energy and

dedication continue to keep St Elizabeth's at the heart of the community. Their commitment helps ensure that the church remains a welcoming place where faith can flourish and people can come together. A special thank you must also go to Mike Knight, a congregation member, who has lovingly restored the foundation stone to its former glory.

At the heart of the celebrations is 'Murmuration', a spectacular community artwork created by local artist Brian Whitmore. Around 500 handmade paper birds, each created by members of the community, have formed a breathtaking installation reflecting "150 Years of Faith in Aspull." Together, they represent the many people whose lives and faith have been woven into the story of St Elizabeth's.

As the anniversary year continues, St Elizabeth's looks forward with gratitude for its past, joy in its present and faith and hope for the future.

As the Church's Anniversary approaches, a special video will be released in October to celebrate this historic milestone and the lasting impact of the church. The video will be available on our Youtube channel.
